The Teachers Desks

In November, our Unit Study is "We are Thankful", we will have activities and discussions in class about what the children are thankful for in their lives. The children will learn about the Native American Indians and Pilgrims. They will learn what it was like at the first Thanksgiving including what kind of foods would have been eaten during this time period.

On November 10th we will have our class cooking day. We will be making Pumpkin Bread; the bread will be frozen and stored for our Thanksgiving Feast and celebration on Tuesday November 22nd. On November 22nd we make homemade butter to go with our Pumpkin Bread. The children will experiment making sweet butter and salted butter. Throughout the month we will continue our learning lessons including numbers, alphabet letters, and sounds. We will also be reviewing colors and shapes.

Our Christmas Pageant will be held on December 10th at 10 AM. We will be practicing for the pageant all month long. Your child will pick a part (they pick a folded paper with pageant parts on it from a container) to see what he or she will be for the pageant. The Preschool will provide all of the costumes. The children do not need to learn any speaking lines. The pageant consists of the reading of "The Christmas Story" and performances and songs sung by the children.

It doesn't seem possible that October is almost over and November is approaching us. The school year is flying by so quickly. The children have accomplished so much already within the few weeks that school has been in session.

In the month of October, we continued our review of shapes and colors and numbers 0-10. We also learned the letters: *Ee, Ff, Pp, Oo, Qq and Hh*. We talked about our *Community Helpers (Police Men, and Firemen etc. etc.*). Thank you for those that brought in their "What I want to be when I grow up" projects. They were very creative and the children had fun guessing what their classmates wanted to be when they grew up.

The children practiced dialing the number 911 for emergency calls. We also practiced our Fire Safety Rules The "Stop! Drop! And Roll!" method, the "Get out and Stay out!" rule. Many thanks go to the Firemen at the Tinicum Firehouse for their lessons on Fire Safety. I know that the children had a wonderful time as well as the teachers. I do have to say how very proud I am of the children with the Fire Drills we have done in the classrooms. With our surprise drills, the children followed the plan and we were out of the building in under 30 seconds. We will continue to keep practicing these drills in all sorts of weather to make sure we are fully prepared in the event there is ever a fire in our school. As November begins, we will be learning the letters Bb, Ii, Mm, Nn, Rr, Tt and Zz. We will be learning about Thanksgiving and how it became a holiday. The children and I will talk about what we are thankful for. Our cooking day is on Friday November 18th. Look for signup sheets for the Thanksgiving Party which will be held on Wednesday November 23rd.

We will have a lesson on the *FOOD PYRAMID* and I am looking forward to this lesson with the children especially about making good choices when it comes to eating *HEALTHY*!

Also, Parents, the *Christmas* P*ageant* is right around the corner. We will be practicing our songs and periodically go into the church for practices. I am looking forward to another great month with the children. Happy Thanksgiving to you all!

Hello Parents! October has been a blast! The children have adjusted so well. We had done so many adorable projects to go along with our unit theme "Community Helpers." Some community helpers that we learned about were Doctors, Nurses, Librarians, Teachers, Police Officers (They looked so adorable in their handmade uniforms!) Firefighters and Dentists. This has been a great unit and I am beyond proud of the children. This past month we have also reviewed numbers 1 through 5 as well as practicing writing them. Rhyming was also a huge hit. I had made up clip cards to give the children some hands on learning which made learning so much fun. I also made these cards for matching the beginning sounds and counting. I use these to go along with my daily lesson during circle time and they are always asking for more! We also have worked on letters Pp,Oo,Qq,Ee,Ff, Bb and Hh and began on patterns. Towards the end of October we had visited the fire station and the kids had so much fun. Their favorite parts were being able to see the trucks and taking turns sitting in them. We also had some Halloween fun! The kids were able to create their own trick-or-treat bags while we talked about what is Real and what is Pretend. (They are so smart!) For the month of November our unit will be "Being Thankful." I am looking forward to this unit along with prepping for the Holidays. I can not wait to hear about the things the kids are thankful for this year. We will be learning about the meaning of Thanksgiving and how it all started. We also will be closing up on our numbers 1 through 5 and begin on working on writing the numbers 6 through 10. Since the children are so smart and already know their shapes, we will begin on learning how many sides each shape has. We also will be experimenting with colors by using various colors of paint and mixing them together to see what we get. Another thing we will be working on is eating healthy as well as the food pyramid. In October we learned about the Dentist and how good foods and brushing/flossing our teeth help keep us healthy. During November I will be expanding on this by teaching them the various ways to eat and keep healthy. Since rhyming went so well, we will be learning about opposites and more on patterns. The letters we will be learning are Ii, Tt, Zz, Mm, Nn and Rr. I am so excited and can't wait to see where November takes us. We will have so much fun!!
