Through out the month of November our Unit Study will be “We are Thankful”. We will have discussions in class about what the children are thankful for in their lives. In class we will talk about how important it is to help other people and what are some of the ways we can help others. The children will learn about why we celebrate the holiday called “Thanksgiving”. They will learn about what it was like at the first Thanksgiving feast, such as what kind of games the children played, what chores they had, and what kind of foods would have been eaten during that time period. The Tuesday before Thanksgiving we will have our Thanksgiving Feast and Celebration in school. We have already started practicing some of our songs for our Christmas Pageant that will be held on December 9th. After our Bible stories in the Church two weeks ago I gave the children an opportunity to practice two songs in the Church to help prepare them for where they will be standing for the Christmas Pageant. In the near future the children will pick their parts for the pageant and will try on their costumes. The school will provide the costumes for the children. You will receive a note telling you what time your pageant is and what part your child will have in the pageant. At the pageant one of the teachers will read the Christmas Story while the children will sing songs and perform a song in the Hand Bell Choir. We will continue to learn and practice our songs through out the month of November into December leading up to the Christmas Pageant. During the month we will continue our lessons on numbers and counting, alphabet letters and sounds, rhyming and opposites, reviewing colors and shapes along with other learning activities.

In the month of October, we continued our review of shapes and colors and numbers 0-10. We also learned the letters: **Ee, Ff, Pp, Oo, Qq and Hh**. We talked about our **Community Helpers (Police Men, and Firemen etc. etc.)**. Thank you for those that brought in their “What I want to be when I grow up” BAGS. They were very creative and the children had fun guessing what their classmates wanted to be when they grow up.

The children practiced dialing the number **911** for emergency calls. We also practiced our Fire Safety Rules The **“Stop! Drop! And Roll!”** method, the **“Get out and Stay out!”** rule. Many thanks go to the Firemen at the Tincum Firehouse for their lessons on Fire Safety. I know that the children had a wonderful time as well as the teachers. I do have to say how very proud I am of the children with the Fire Drills we have done in the classrooms. With our surprise drills, the children followed the plan and we were out of the building in under 60 seconds. We will continue to keep practicing these drills in all sorts of weather to make sure we are fully prepared in the event there is ever a fire in our school. As November begins, we will be learning the letters **Bb, Ii, Mm, Nn, Rr, Tt and Zz**. We will be learning about **Thanksgiving** and how it became a holiday. The children and I will talk about what we are thankful for. Our cooking day is on **Friday November 17th**. Look for signup sheets for the Thanksgiving Party which will be held on **Wednesday November 22nd**.

We will have a lesson on the **FOOD PYRAMID** and I am looking forward to this lesson with the children especially about making good choices when it comes to eating **HEALTHY!**

Also, Parents, the **Christmas Pageant** is right around the corner. We will be practicing our songs and periodically go into the church for practices. I am looking forward to another great month with the children. Happy Thanksgiving to you all!

I can not wait to hear about the things the kids are thankful for this year. We will be learning about the meaning of Thanksgiving and how it all started. We also will be closing up on our numbers 1 through 5 and begin on working on writing the numbers 6 through 10. We will continue to talk about their shapes and we will begin on learning how many sides each shape has. We also will be experimenting with colors by using various colors of paint and mixing them together to see what we get.

The letters we will be learning are li, Tt, Zz, Mm, Nn and Rr.

I am so excited and can't wait to see where November takes us. We will have so much fun!!
