The Teachers Desks

The children have settled in nicely and are getting use to our class routine. They have already made new friendships and are exploring new learning experiences every day. We have held classes in both classrooms, this gave the children time to explore and become familiar with both of the classrooms.

In September our unit was Concept of Self - "God made me Special". The children have been learning about different ways God made each one of us special in our own way and what are some of our similarities. One day we made a graph using the children's hair and eye color and we also graphed whether they were a boy or a girl. The children learned the importance of eating healthy, drinking plenty of water, and exercising to take care of their bodies. Our class also explored their five senses through a fun food tasting activity.

This week the children are learning about what it was like when Jesus was a baby and as he was growing up as a young boy. We are comparing it to what it is like being a child today. We will finish up our unit with our Culminating Event (end of our unit) sampling food Jesus may have eaten that we can still eat today. The children will make matzah and we will have asbusa (this is a type of cookie bar) and grapes. I will be sending home information about a project the children will be doing at home called "What I Want to be When I Grow Up".

In October we will start our unit about "Community Helpers" along with our visit to the Tinicum Firehouse. We will also have a unit about "Autumn/Fall" that will include Halloween where we will discuss the differences between real and pretend. At the end of the month we will have our Halloween Party on October 27th. The children will come to school at 10:00 AM, not our regular time, dismissal will be normal time 11:30 AM. The children will arrive in costumes. Do not send in any type of pretend weapons, wands etc. save your props for trick or treating. *We will have a Halloween Parade approximately 10:10 AM on the 27th family and friends are invited to attend. The children will parade inside the Church Hall in their Halloween costume, we will bring the children into the hall. We ask for everyone to stay seated at the tables when the children are having their parade. After the parade the children will return to the classroom for their Halloween Party. The party is for the children only.

Dear Parents.

I cannot believe that September is over and October has begun! The children have adjusted so well to our classroom routine and not too many tears have been shed.

We have accomplished so much since the start of school. We have reviewed colors, shapes and started our weekly alphabet letter. We have reviewed the letters Xx, Ss and Aa. Please have the children bring in their "Show and Tell" using any item that begins with the letter of the week. If they cannot find anything with that letter, please just have them draw it. The children seem to really enjoy this activity and it also gives them a chance to do a bit of public speaking.

We talked about how God made us all different and about God's Creation. The children learned about 5 Senses and how important it is to See, Hear, Taste, Smell and Touch.

We enjoyed our **5** Senses activity. We were able to feel sea shells, a smooth glass egg, a geo and cooked pasta. The children used their sense of taste with tasting a lemon which was sour, oranges which were sweet, an apple that was tart and pretzel sticks that were salty. We used our sense of smell by smelling, basil leaves, cinnamon and minced garlic. We used our sense of hearing by listening to the outside noises and we turned out the lights and closed our eyes to see what it would be like not being able to see.

I would like to say a special THANK YOU to SPC Michael Lawlar for coming into the classroom to talk to the children about his special job in the Army. The children had loads of fun listening to his job description and loved being able to try on his Army helmet and vest. We thank you SPC Michael Lawlar for your service to us and to our country.

In the month of October, we will be discussing about our Community Helpers (Firemen, Police officers, Teachers Nurses etc.)
We are also going to discuss about Halloween and how not to be afraid of the masks. We are going to talk about **REAL** and or **PRETEND**. We will also be reviewing letters Bb, Ee, Ff, Hh, Pp, Oo, and Qq. I look forward to another great month ahead.

Picture Day


Preschool picture day is coming! Fliers were sent home with each student with full information pertaining to possible packages and options. It is recommended to dress your child in bright colors for best results.

Halloween Celebrations

This year's Halloween parties will be held on the following dates. Please note that the class party times are 10:00 to 11:30 AM both days. It is a shortened school day for the children. There will NOT be afternoon classes that day.

There will be sign-up sheets on the bulletin board for those parents wishing to contribute party items. If you are signing up for a treat, please bring it in the day of your child's party and label it with your child's name & class. Please supply treats enough for all class sizes. (Ask teachers for class count).

The children are to come to school in costume. Please <u>DO NOT</u> allow your child to wear a mask. Many preschoolers are frightened by false faces, and have trouble seeing through those tiny eyeholes. A good alternative is to use face make-up, which is less frightening and much safer. <u>Please no weapons of any type</u> accompanying costumes.

Weather permitting; classes will parade, in costume, within the schoolyard. Families and friends, feel free to stay and view the parade from outside the fenced area. In the event it is raining, the parade will be held in the church hall.

Communications & Attendance

The preschool staff understands that it is only the 2nd month of school; however, all ready we are experiencing problems with incorrect or outdated telephone numbers and email addresses. We cannot stress enough the importance of this information and its accuracy! (Imagine yourself trying to reach us, when your child is in our care, and our phone number being incorrect or disconnected!)

PLEASE NOTIFY THE SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY IF THERE IS A CHANGE OF ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, E-MAIL ADDRESS OR EMERGENCY CONTACT NAME & NUMBERS.

As well, please be **prompt in picking up** your child - 11:30 AM for the morning classes and 2:30 PM for the afternoon or full day classes. It is very upsetting for a young child to be left waiting after all the others have gone. Your child depends on you and trusts you to be there. Also, our staff of teachers have private appointments of their own to meet after classes. If an emergency arises, please call us so we may reassure your child and explain why you are late. Parents' continued lateness would be brought to the attention of the preschool's governing body.

The "Pick-Up ID" tag with your child's name must be shown to the teaching staff for your child to be released. No child will be released to someone other than you without a tag; this is for your child's safety. If a Pick-Up ID tag is not presented, your child will be retained until we can make contact with you regarding their release.

Also, we are asking that the students be dressed in casual, easy access clothing. Student outfits with belts, flies, tights, etc. are just beautiful, however, so impractical for potty time. Please try to dress your child in clothing that has elastic waistbands and outfits that are easy for the students to tend to bathroom emergencies. There is nothing worst than trying to aide a student for potty, along with a possible 19 others waiting in line doing jigs, with clothing that takes forever to adjust.

There are still some student emergency cards that have not been turned in as of yet. It is very important that we have these cards for contact information within the classrooms. We ask that you please return them within the next week. Should you need one just let the teachers know and we will send it home with your preschooler.
